Measuring What Matters Most: Best-In-Class Methods for Evaluating Population Health Interventions

Population health management programs can be difficult to study and evaluate, which can lead to systematic underinvestment in these efforts. You can help build the evidence base by measuring and disseminating the results of your programs. This workshop will discuss practical considerations for evaluating population health interventions, including monitoring progress during program implementation and measuring success after a program has matured. We will review the best-in-class study designs, methods from epidemiology, and methods to maximize the validity of your findings. We will also discuss special considerations for measuring costs and return on investment, and how these can help build the business case for population health management.

Stoddard Davenport is a *Healthcare Management Consultant* at **Milliman**. Stoddard is a healthcare management consultant with the Denver office of Milliman. He joined the firm in 2011, and helps lead our behavioral health and population health teams.
